Get Support, an app for refugees to navigate the desired social and local services.

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Project Description

According to the UN Refugee Convention, the definition of a refugee is someone who: 'owing to a well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group, or political opinion, is outside the country of his nationality, and is unable to or, owing to such fear, is unwilling to avail himself of the protection of that country' (Article 1, 1951 Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees).

Refugees come to the UK from different countries and different regions of within one country itself. According to the UNHCR (Immigration statistics, year ending September 2020), my country Eritrea was one of the top five countries of nationality for asylum applications in the UK. Councils help refugees who are victims of torture, persecution, and war to build their future in different parts of Wales via professional advice, support and advocacy services and ensure they can access the services they need.

During my stay as a volunteer in refugee action, I was giving relevant advice and guidance to asylum seeker and refugees on how to get support from local and social services. But to get these services, the refugees/Asylum seekers need to contact or visit the council office. Their technology awareness is very low to browse and navigate social services and other local services on their own.

So, developing a website that could provide all the list of social and local services in Wales would be beneficial. The application should be able to provide the necessary information in English, Arabic and Tigrigna languages. Moreover, due to the current situation of COVID19 and lockdown rule, refugees could face more challenges of getting help. And this problem could be minimized by creating a secure and safe chat room for the refugees to get advice and support within the website.

Project Aims & Objectives

Aims:

- Create a system in the form of a website, which can search through the social and local services inside Wales and returning the results of recommended information or links to the user depending on the criteria they have selected. The website would have to provide a selection of the desired service lists (e.g., well-being, charity organizations, bank. Etc).
- Give all the information in English, Arabic, and Tigrigna languages
- Prepare a reliable and secure channel for chat purpose between the council member(advisor) and the user (refugee/asylum seeker).
- Simple to use, responsive, and satisfactory in returning the right information.

Objectives:

- Considering the variety of the refugees/asylum-seekers, intensive research will be carried out to find the necessary list of social and local services in Wales.
- To decide which Python framework, Flask or Django, is the best option for this project and make the right decision, another research will be conducted to find the cons and pros of each framework.
- As the website is expected to be multilingual, further investigation will be performed to determine which translation library is suitable for the website.
- Visualise all the list of social and local services along with their details and contact information in different languages.
- Prepare admin and client registration and login, and let refugees get advice or support through the chat service from the council who is going to own this website.

Work Plan

Weekly meeting with my supervisor, Dr Catherine Teehan, will be held to review and discuss the progress of the project. In case of parties' absence, either meeting will be postponed to the appropriate time or update of the progress will be delivered via email.
